Previous Meeting

Police Liaison Officer - Debbie DeBree

We welcomed Debbie as the guest speaker for the last meeting. The role of Police Liaison Officer is a relatively new role, commencing in 1992 following a recommendation from a royal commission into *Aboriginal Death's in Custody*. Brisbane's first PLO commenced work during 1995. Since then we have seen them in a variety of places, such as major shopping centres.

Presently, there are 140 liaison officers in Queensland with 13 officers on Brisbane's north side representing ethnic groups such as Vietnamese, Fijian, Chinese, Croatian and Samoan. They operate in police area's such as Petrie, Sandgate, Chermside, Indooroopilly and Fortitude Valley.

Although the PLO's work for the Queensland police force and wear a blue uniform - identified by their yellow epilates; they are not police officers and don't have any special powers (like regular police). They are useful in a different capacity: to assist police, often in matters where a personal touch is required; they assist victims of crime. They may also participate in some pro-active policing; at schools or the PCYC.

Because they aren't as threatening as a Police Officer, they assist in truancy problems with schools, often helping people get in touch with different agencies that can provide assistance.

Anyone interested in becoming a PLO. Following a three week course at the police academy, you will be mentored with a seasoned PLO before being deployed on your own.

The home owner saw some people running to cars and another resident saw them jump into 2 cars, one a late model 4WD white in colour and the other a Torana.
