Your first Neighbourhood watch meeting

What can you expect at your first Neighbourhood watch meeting? At each meeting, we typically have a speaker drawn from varied walks of life. All relevant, all interesting. Our next speaker is from the Queensland Police Fraud Squad. We also have regular reports from our Police Liaison Officer (Mario) on crime on ours and adjacent areas.

Meeting are normally over by 8pm, so you invest an hour to know what is happening in your community, and take home stories that can be shared at the office water cooler.

Your Neighbourhood watch kit

There are several new neighbours that have moved in subsequent to us first canvassing the area. Don't be left out, we want you in the community. Contact your Zone Co-ordinator (phone number on the back page), or our Area Co-ordinator, Mary (phone number top of this page) to arrange a kit. Included in the kit is the letterbox plaque, a visual deterrent to potential criminals.

Engraving of possessions

For all of us that have purchased new equipment (TV / DVD player / Play station / X-Box etc), this is a timely reminder to borrow the NHW engraver and mark each of your possessions with your personal identity. New rules mean that you don't need to register each piece of equipment with the police, rather just register your identification number. Queensland police recommend the following code is engraved on your equipment:

INITIALS + Date of Birth + 'Q'

So, if your name is Bill Clinton, born on the 19 August 1946: BC190846Q

Contact your zone co-ordinator for assistance, and to borrow the engraver.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY PUT ICE IN YOUR MOBILE PHONE

Emergency Services Minister Chris Cummins is encouraging Queenslanders to put ICE in their mobile phones. Mr Cummins told Parliament's Estimates hearing today that everyone should put a phone number of their next of kin in their mobile phone in case of emergencies - headed ICE. "I encourage people to put an 'in case of emergency' number in their mobile phone," he told the Estimates hearing. "This is a campaign encouraging people to store personal details on their mobile phones to help identify victims of accidents and disasters which has come to our attention since the London bombings.

"Mobile phone users are being urged to enter a number in their phone's memory under the heading "i-c-e" - in case of emergency. "It can be a case of the phone number could be headed ICE wife or ICE brother, or ICE father and so on." Mr Cummins said the ICE system could be very helpful to paramedics if they come across an accident scene where a person may be unconscious and they need to contact their next of kin for vital information about their health and medication needs. workers in danger, but also the motorists as changes have normally been made to the road.
