Streisand Drive

In an effort to combat rampant speeding we requested Brisbane City Council increase visibility of the speed limit along this popular stretch of road. They responded to our request with a number of street markings. So - no excuse now, Streisand drive is well signed at 40 kph. We can all help preventing a tragedy in our neighbourhood by staying within the posted speed limit.

Cash Register Security

Police are encouraging retail business owners / managers to ensure that their staff are aware of cash register security and follow the below guidelines

- Only open the cash drawer when the customer is paying for a service or purchasing a product. Close the cash drawer before the product is packaged.
- Where practical, lock the cash drawer and remove the key when not in use.
- Minimise the visibility of the cash drawer, especially when it is open.
- Use an audible device that indicates the opening of the cash drawer
- Clear excess cash from the cash register frequently and randomly and keep as little money on the work premises as possible
- Put excess cash into a safe
- Use and encourage cashless purchasing, such as credit cards and EFTPOS
- Do not use the cash register to store cash when the workplace is unattended.

Police Report

The Glendora area is again very quiet, with no reported incidents in our immediate area. However we should remain vigilant as there are always events in neighbouring areas. There have been break-in in Petrie, Eatons Hill with DVD players, laptop computers targeted while owners were at home sleeping.

Drink driving and speeding warning

Police are alarmed that despite earlier warnings, motorists continue to speed and drink drive after numerous incidents across the state.

In the week between Christmas and new year, police from the Pine Rivers District detected drivers traveling at dangerously excessive speeds including 159km/hr, 151km/hr and 132km/hr in a 100km/hr zones.

A 22 year old male recorded a blood alcohol reading of .208 after being pulled over by police on Gordons Crossing Road, Joyner.

Traffic offences included 12 people being charged with Drink Driving and 8 people being charged with Driving whilst Disqualified.

The Queensland Police Service is pleading with motorists not to drink and drive. Police are also concerned that speeding motorists continue to be a major problem on Queensland roads, along with failure to wear a seat belt and driving when tired.

Police in the Pine Rivers District and across the state will continue to maintain a high presence, in an attempt to reduce the carnage on Queensland roads. Motorists need to understand that road safety is up to them.
