Thieves seize opportunity during major events

POLICE are advising residents to be extra vigilant during major sporting events, due to an increase in the number of reported break and enters into houses and vehicles in the area. Pine Rivers District crime prevention co-ordinator, Acting Sergeant Tammy White said the recent Mundine vs. Green fight and Game 1 of the State of Origin series led to a spate of break-ins to houses and vehicles being reported to police the following day.

“It is unfortunate that thieves seize the opportunity to strike whilst people’s attention is focused on enjoying watching their favourite sporting events on television in the comfort of their own homes or at a licensed premise”, Acting Sergeant White said. “However there a number of security measures that residents can take to ensure that their motor vehicles and homes are protected during these events.

“Most importantly, parents supporting their favourite team should ensure their children are supervised during these events,” she said. “It’s important to know where and what their children are doing as opposed to leaving them unsupervised to roam the streets and get into trouble.

“If celebrating at home, don’t leave windows or doors open in unattended rooms of the house to reduce the likelihood of potential thieves getting in and out undetected. “When going out, ensure your house is properly secured by checking that all windows and doors locked. Extra initiatives such as leaving lights on and installing sensor lights will also help to deter would be thieves“, Acting Sergeant White said.

To reduce the likelihood of opportunistic thieves breaking into your motor vehicle:

- Always lock doors and close windows when your motor vehicle is unattended;
- Park your vehicle off the street, preferably in your yard and/or a secure garage;
- If parking your motor vehicle on the street, select a well lit area;
- Install and use an effective security device; and
- Don’t leave any valuables in your car.
