Last Meeting

Senior Constable Warren Carpenter, fresh from a stint with the police traffic branch, enlightened a captive audience to many unusual facets of motoring in Queensland. Like other proceedings in court, the police must provide evidence for motor vehicle offences that is beyond reasonable doubt. Whilst video and other recorded evidence may be used in court, it must be supported by a witness willing to testify in court. Other interesting facts include:

- Speed camera guidelines allow cameras to be placed at the foot of hills
- Speed camera sites are selected on primarily on speed related accident history, then resident complaints and observations.
- Hand held speed detection devices can be used anywhere there is a safe working environment.
- Hand held laser devices have a 1.2 kilometre range with a ± 2 kph accuracy.

At the meeting we found out what actually happens inside a speed camera vehicle!

POLICE MINISTER ANNOUNCES PROJECT TO TURN THE SCREWS ON CRIME

Queensland Police are tightening the screws on number plate thieves. Police Minister Judy Spence launched a project "Turning the Screws on Crime". Police are providing free 'one-way' screws for vehicle number plates, which cannot be removed using conventional tools. "Numberplate theft costs countless Queenslanders thousands of dollars each year," Ms Spence said. "Numberplates are typically stolen for their use in more serious crimes such as break and enters, robberies and service station drive-offs.

Over the next six months, motorists would be able to attend community awareness days at Bunnings hardware stores in North Brisbane, Pine Rivers and Redcliffe police districts where they can have the screws fitted free of charge. Community awareness days will be held (in our area) on:

- April 8 - Carseldine
- May 6 - Stafford.

Police warn public about card skimming at ATMs

Police are urging members of the public to be cautious when using automatic teller machines (ATM) following a report of a card skimming operation in Brisbane City. On February 21 an alert member of the public discovered a skimming device attached to the ATM he was about to use in the vicinity of Brisbane's Myer Centre. After removing the device, he was approached by three men who grabbed the device from him and walked away. The Queensland Police Fraud and Corporate Crime Group are currently investigating the skimming device incident.
