Information Round Up

A representative from the Queensland Law Society entertained and informed us with many interesting anecdotes from his long history as a lawyer. He imparted some key knowledge about wills:

- Prepare a will.
- Leave a set of instructions for items of special sentiment and dollar value.
- Disclose your financial profile to someone (impartial) of trust. This can be very important as the remaining relatives have no way to discover accounts following your passing.

The latest anti-theft technology are known as 'Data Dots'. Originally developed for the automotive industry, they have evolved where a \$60 application of data-dots is enough to cover all your electrical possessions. Invisible to the human eye, they allow Police to discover the owner by comparing your records to their repository of information. It's recommended you also retain the instruction manuals for your equipment to facilitate the easy verification of model numbers. Sandgate and Arana Hills PCYC can assist further.

Our Police constable Zoe, will have the breathalyser unit operating at the next meeting. Here is your opportunity to have a glass or two of wine and measure your reading in controlled circumstances. Bring a designated driver (maybe you could bring your neighbour!).

Police Report

Although Break and Enter crimes are marginally down in Queensland (and very low in our area), there has been a disturbing trend of 'steal to order' break and enter offences, from commercial premises (retail shops) instead of private residence. Typically break and enter offences are committed Monday to Friday 6am to 10am. DNA evidence (from cigarette butts, bottles) is increasingly being used to convict offenders.
